The importance of stable housing

Housing insecurity is a crisis.

Families that are in temporary housing or rent burdened or facing eviction are often operating in survival mode.

Income-based affordable housing aims to provide stable housing that can serve as a platform for enabling residents to thrive.

Pairing public housing with social services

Recent efforts include:

- Family Self-Sufficiency Program
- Resident Opportunity and Social Service Coordinator Program
- Choice Neighborhoods
- Envision Centers

Family Self Sufficiency Program

- Mixed success – for some families, this works as designed
 - Participants receive educational/employment related services leading to higher incomes and in turn, escrow savings that they receive upon completion of the 5-year program.
 - For others, the program is too rigid, or they don't remain in public housing long enough to complete the program and benefit fully.

Limited Resources

- The Choice Neighborhood Initiative is extremely competitive, and few communities receive grants.
- ROSS program also has limited funding.
- Envision Centers had no funding attached and were dependent upon local resources.

Post – COVID Needs

- The eviction moratorium and Emergency Rental Assistance Program helped many families to remain in their homes.
- Resources are needed long before a family is at risk of eviction.
- Public Housing Authorities are reporting that their residents still need support.

Location and Communities Matter

- There are big differences in the availability of supportive programs and services.
- Large PHAs in larger cities tend to have larger staffs and better access to community resources followed by smaller cities and then smaller rural PHAs.

Importance of Community

- Building a community of residents in Public Housing Developments can be beneficial.
- Developing partnerships with community-based organizations when available is critical.
- Getting creative.

Continued Work

- Identifying any funding opportunities or new resources for residents.
- Emphasizing the importance of services in keeping residents housed.
- Emphasis on flexible resources that respond to community needs.
